The Board of Internal Economy of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan is accepting applications for the position of Information and Privacy Commissioner for the Province of Saskatchewan.

Appointed under the authority of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, the position of Information and Privacy Commissioner (IPC) is a statutory officer of the Legislature. As an officer of the Legislative Assembly, the IPC is neither an employee of the government, nor responsible to any minister or member. The IPC is accountable to the Assembly as a whole and the office's budget is reviewed and approved by the Board of Internal Economy.

The Office responds to complaints from individuals who believe their privacy has not been respected and, upon request, will review access request decisions made by government institutions, local authorities or Health Information Trustees and provide recommendations (based on reviews) on legislation, policies or practices that may impact citizen's access or privacy rights. The Commissioner undertakes and publishes research related to the protection of personal information, promotes awareness and understanding of privacy issues and may offer comment to Members of the Legislative Assembly, government institutions, local authorities or Health Information Trustees which are considering new legislation, policies or programs that will or may affect the access and privacy rights of Saskatchewan citizens.

The Board invites candidates with extensive and senior leadership skills with management experience which includes visioning, strategic planning and management of human and financial resources. The successful candidate will possess exceptional collaboration and mediation skills and be able to establish relationships and gain acceptance from a wide range of stakeholders including government officials, program administrators, and the general public. Experience working with complex and sensitive issues, preferably in areas related to privacy is desired, as is experience in the interpretation and application of legislation, regulation and policies. Knowledge of current and emerging technologies and their relationship to privacy and access issues will be important.
